Minutes of the Metuchen Historic Preservation Committee Regular Meeting Ianuary 23, 2020

Chair Nancy Zerbe called the January 23, 2020 regularly scheduled meeting of the Metuchen Historic Preservation Committee (HPC) to order at 7:31 p.m.

Public Comment: No members of the public were present.

Review of Minutes: Review of the December minutes was deferred to the February meeting.

Welcome of New Members: New committee members Steven Patrick and Thomas Mullins were welcomed and provided with a review of the committee's current and pending work.

Ongoing Business

Historic Preservation Element of the Municipal Master Plan: The Committee discussed the current status of the draft element and addressed a few outstanding issues, including the need for higher-resolution photographs, the transfer of the historic resources inventories in Chapter 6.2 into a separate appendix, and various minor editorial changes. This round of revisions is to be submitted to the consultant and a revised draft provided for the Committee's review.

Historic District Signage: Todd Pagel requested an electronic version of the signage we are recommending for the Middlesex Avenue–Woodwild Park Historic District to share with the borough.

New Business

New Jersey Historic Trust Grant: Nancy Zerbe reported meeting with the borough's grant writer to discuss applying to this year's grant program; grant applications are due April 23. After discussing potential grant projects, the committee agreed to prioritize professional assistance with the development of a draft historic preservation ordinance. Members also discussed individuals and organizations that might provide letters of support for a grant application, including the Metuchen Downtown Alliance, Chamber of Commerce, Woodwild Park Association, Metuchen-Edison Historical Society, Historic Preservation Committee, Borough Improvement League, and Metuchen Arts Council.

Old Business

Mary Wilkins Freeman House: This Lake Avenue house—the only extant house associated with the noted author during her writing career—was listed on the National Register of Historic Places on January 17, 2020.

Adjournment: There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:16 p.m.
