

BOROUGH OF METUCHEN COUNCIL MINUTES
January 19, 2016
7:30 PM

The Regular Meeting of the Borough Council was held in the Council Chambers of Borough Hall on Tuesday, January 19, 2016.

The Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Cammarano.

Adequate notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Act, pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231. Said notice was sent to the Home News Tribune and Star Ledger on January 4, 2016, posted in Borough Hall and on file in the Clerk's Office. All requirements of the "Open Public Meetings Act" have been satisfied.

The Invocation was given by Council President Grayzel and followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present were Councilmembers Inzerro, Muldoon, Rasmussen, Wallace, Council President Grayzel and Mayor Cammarano. Councilman Leibfried was absent. Also present were Jennifer Maier, Borough Administrator, Denis Murphy, Esq. and Susan Jackson, Borough Clerk.

Agenda Session

Council President Grayzel made a motion to open the Agenda Session, second by Councilman Muldoon, with all in favor, motion carries, 5-0.

Councilwoman Rasmussen asked the status of the Noise Ordinance. Mayor Cammarano responded that the model Noise Ordinance is on for the next meeting agenda for proposal/Introduction.

Councilwoman Inzerro asked about the Coffee Shop on Main Street with the boards and fence in front of it. Mayor Cammarano doesn't have an update at this time but will talk with Chris Cosenza to find out and report back.

Councilman Muldoon gave an update on the meeting held this morning sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce. The topic was on the Downtown Improvement Districts and the Main Street NJ Program. It was well attended by about 125 people. The panel consisted of the Executive Director and business owner from Downtown Somerville Alliance, Board President and business owner from Highland Park Main Street Organization, Eric Berger from Metuchen and Ruchir Mewawala, part owner of Budha's Loft Salon. The meeting was to share information with landlords, business owners and residents about what other towns have done to revitalize their downtown. It will be on MeTV under Video-on-Demand if anyone is interested in watching the presentation.

He also invited everyone to attend a community meeting on Tuesday, January 26th at the Senior Center at 7:00pm. It will be on the Downtown Improvement District. Members of the Metuchen Stakeholder Group will be presenting an updated report on the study they have been working on for about eight months.

With no further actions taken Mayor Cammarano asked for a motion to close the agenda session.

Ms. Maier responded that the additional funding has been put in for the crossing light. There is a meeting coming up with the Engineers who will be doing the drawings and specifications for that whole project. Once the plans are complete it will go out for bid and then construction will begin.

Reports of Councilmembers

Mayor Cammarano opened Reports of Councilmembers.

Council President Grayzel –

- Councilmen Wallace, Muldoon and Council President Grayzel attended the Traffic and Transportation meeting featuring a kickoff of the Street Smart Program which will start up in March. Metuchen is one of 11 NJ communities selected for Phase 2 of this program. Many community groups attended this meeting. The Street Smart Program is a public education/awareness and behavioral change program designed to help communities promote pedestrian safety in their local communities. Jeffrey Perlman and Keith Hamas of the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority were among the presenters. Keith Hamas and Officer Bauer will be giving a brief presentation at the Borough Council meeting on February 16th at 7:30pm.
- The reduced speed to 25mph on Grove Street has been implemented.
- The enhanced traffic enforcement program by the Metuchen Police is in its third month.
- The new dog park will take a step closer to reality with a pre-construction meeting on Wednesday at Edison Municipal Hall. The construction is slated to begin, weather permitting, this winter to start the site work.
- The parking deck at Pearl Street continues to make progress. The apartment construction is underway with ongoing site work for Phase 1 (West Building).
- A joint meeting of the Accessibility meeting and Parking Authority s on January 28th at 7:00pm in the Borough Hall Chambers. John Jahr, a licensed professional Engineer, will be giving his evaluation of handicap parking downtown.
- The new show in the Rotunda Gallery is by artist Diane Savona. Diane is an artist, teacher and collector of domestic artifacts. The show will close in February.
- The Art Council will present the New Jersey Brass Quintet on Sunday, February 7th at 3:00pm at Metuchen High School. They are doing a children’s performance of “All around the World” with musical selections performed on trumpets, horn, trombone and tuba. Tickets are \$10 for adults and children under 12 are free. - Kate Masey will be coming to present the winter programs for Family Arts of Metuchen at the next Council meeting. There is a complete list of the programs on the website at www.familyartsofmetuchen.org.

Councilwoman Inserro –

- Metuchen Senior Citizen hold tax preparation for Seniors on Tuesday and Thursday starting in February. Please call for an appointment if you need to get your taxes done.
- On January 31st at 2:00pm, through the generosity of Sakula Yoga Studio, the Metuchen Municipal Alliance, in partnership with Metuchen High School Project Graduation, is offering a free gentle yoga class. This is a fundraiser for Municipal Alliance and donation will be graciously accepted for the Metuchen Municipal Alliance. The Metuchen Municipal Alliance continues in its tradition as one of the lead sponsors of Metuchen High School Project Graduation.
- Municipal Alliance is starting a new program in February called “Strengthening Families”. It is for families. It is a dinner program that runs for seven weeks and it is to encourage good communication between parents and middle school age students between the ages of 10 and 14.

Councilman Muldoon –

- Historic Preservation Committee held their 2016 reorganization meeting last week. Nancy Zerbe is Chairperson. A special thank you to Tyreen Reuter for her last 6 years as chairperson and her continue service on the committee.
- The Parking Authority is currently meeting tonight and a report will be given at the next Council meeting.

Councilwoman Rasmussen –

- She reported on the status of Anthony Smith, a 2002 graduate of Metuchen High School. He was the victim of a slash and run in Chelsea this weekend. He underwent surgery to repair the damage. Thoughts and prayers go out to him as he recuperates from his injuries.
- Shade Tree Commission welcomes new member Thomas Thompson. The Commission is developing the spring planting list and welcome residents to request trees. Maggie Manza was re-elected chairperson.
- Environmental meeting is tomorrow night. She asked that the Mayor and Council would continue the discussion on the “Cut It and Leave It Grass” program.
- Chamber of Commerce has a new executive director Larry McCullough. The new board is headed by Dorothy Winhold as president. The Chamber rolled out a great procedure manual with all the information needed to successfully run all the events. April 16th will be the annual Garage Sale from 9am-4pm. The annual Gold outing is May 5th from 8am-3pm. Cruise nights will be begin on May 4th and will be on every first Monday through the first week of September.
- The Chamber will also host a series of business seminars to Chamber members at the Metuchen Library February 9th, 16th, and 23rd at 8am and 9:15am. Nonmembers may attend and a \$15.00 donation to Friends of the Metuchen Library is requested.
- With today’s presentation by the Chamber of the Metuchen Downtown Alliance, Councilwoman Rasmussen and the Development Commission is very pleased to lend its support to this important initiative of the Main Street NJ program. It was a collaborative effort of Councilwoman Inserro, Joanne Sabatino-Falkenstein, Nicole Chinchar and Councilwoman Rasmussen to prepare the application to become an associate member of Main Street NJ program. There has been great progress made through the Stakeholders group, supported by Councilmembers Inserro and Muldoon. After a discussion with the Mayor, the Development Commission will be partnering with the Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy to conduct a survey of what our residents want to see downtown. This initiative is intended to support the work of the Metuchen Downtonw Alliance and support them in their goals for the downtown area.

Seeing no one wishing to speak, Mayor Cammarano closed the Public Session.
