BOROUGH OF METUCHEN COUNCIL MINUTES October 24, 2022 7:30 PM

The Regular Meeting of the Borough Council was held in the Council Chambers of Borough Hall on Monday, October 24, 2022.

The Meeting was called to order at 7:31 p.m. by Council President Delia.

Adequate Notice of this meeting has been given in accordance with the Open Public Meeting Act, pursuant to Public Law 1975, Chapter 231. Said notice was sent to the Home News Tribune and Star Ledger on September 21, 2022, posted in Borough Hall, and on file in the Clerk's Office. All requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act have been satisfied.

Council President Delia asked all to rise for the flag salute.

Roll Call

Council President Delia asked for a roll call.

Present were Councilmembers Branch, Kandel, Koskoski, Rasmussen, and Council President Delia. Councilmember Hirsch and Mayor Busch were absent. Also present were Borough Administrator Melissa Perilstein, Borough Clerk Deborah Zupan, and Borough Attorney Denis Murphy.

Agenda Session

Councilmember Rasmussen made a motion to open the Agenda Session, second by Councilmember Kandel, with all in favor, motion carried, 5-0.

With no actions taken, Councilmember Rasmussen made a motion to close the Agenda Session, second by Councilmember Kandel, with all in favor, motion carried, 5-0.

Report

EMS Cadet Angel Thumma gave the following report:

My name is Angel Thumma. I just started at Metuchen High School after moving from New Rochelle, New York. I am 17 years old and became an EMS cadet in July 2022.

I am here tonight to present our report for Summer 2022.

We have taken 197 calls so far this year, which is few less than this time in 2021. We never know how busy we will be. We have had 2 weekend shifts where we took 9 calls in 24 hours. We have had more than 40 different people take calls.

This time of year is always a transition period for us, last year's cadets have gone to college and our new cadets are learning how we operate. Our recruitment has been good recently, we added 5 cadets and 4 adult members since July.

Besides 911 calls we also support community events. We covered 4 High School football games, we took a rig to the farmers market, we took both ambulances to Moss school which might be a first. We also hosted boy scouts and girl scouts. Coming up we have a Roller Derby event on October 30th and another cub scout event on November 4th.

We would like to remind everyone that some people are still getting very sick from Covid. The 911 calls are lower, but we are still getting them but the New Jersey Hospitals are reporting an uptick especially for people on ventilators recently.

Flu has not been a big problem for the last 2 years because most people were wearing masks. Before Covid hit in 2020, we were in a bad flu season. CDC estimated 36 million cases and 25,000 deaths from flu in that season. Now the masks are off, so our message is get your flu shot and get your Covid booster.

If there are any questions I will try to answer them, thank you.

Miguel Cabrita, Assistant Principal at St. Joseph High School, thanked the Borough for allowing a Friday evening game at Saint Joseph's on October 7. He commented that the event generated excitement, energy, and community building.

Jeremy DeCaro, a Junior at Saint Joseph High School, spoke regarding the night game on October 7. He remarked that the event, and the days leading up to it, were memorable and unlike anything he had experienced before.

Charles Algier, a Senior at Saint Joseph High School, also spoke about what a positive experience the night game was for the players and the Saint Joseph Community.

David Boris, a Senior at Saint Joseph High School, described the October 7 night game as a once in a lifetime experience.

Megan Sullivan, 26 Miller Drive, commented that she understood there had been some concern about the night game at Saint Joseph High School, and the week of events leading up to it. As a resident who lives near the school, she thanked the Police who have done a great job handling parking issues when the school has events.

Tim Sullivan, 26 Miller Drive, praised the culture of encouragement and support created at Saint Joseph High School, where his son is a Senior. He commented that despite occasional parking issues of the years, events at the school go smoothly and encourage people to visit our town.

John Nolan, President of Saint Joseph High School, added that after two years of Covid and missing out on many events, he felt it was important to give the students a memorable experience like the night game, and he hopes they can continue in the future.

Michael Masturzo, 86 Willow Road, a neighbor of Saint Joseph High School, and a alumni, felt that the night event was not an issue for their neighborhood, and that it was a memorable event which should continue.

GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2021 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Borough Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall by resolution certify to the Local

Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations;" and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed as a minimum the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations, as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52, to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.
