Roll Call

Agenda Session

Mayor Busch read the following proclamation in honor of National Library Week:

WHEREAS, National Library Week, April 23 to 29, 2023, will be celebrated with the theme "There's More to the Story"; and

WHEREAS, the Metuchen Public Library acts as a cultural, civic, educational, recreational, and lifelong learning institute, a welcoming space for the community and a source of collaborative literary-community partnerships while boasting just under 7000 cardholders in a community with an estimated population of 15,500; and

WHEREAS, the Metuchen Public Library provides programming which brings our community together for entertainment, education and connection through author talks, concerts, crafting classes, book clubs, story times, summer reading programs, and movie nights as well as providing internet access, technology support, and literacy skill development; and

WHEREAS, in 2022 the Metuchen Public Library in offered 650 in-person, virtual, and hybrid programs for children, young adults, and adults with 9600 residents of all ages attending; and

WHEREAS, the hardworking Library Staff, whose goal is to make a difference in the community is supported by the Board of Trustees and by The Friends of the Metuchen Library, who are all volunteers; and

WHEREAS, the Library Board of Trustees is instrumental in administering library services, improving and maintaining infrastructure, and advocating local and state support, while The Friends of the Metuchen Library generate additional financial support for programming through an active calendar of fundraising events such as the Annual Book Sale, the Friends Membership Drive, the Town Wide Garage Sale, and the 10x10x100 Art Sale, events which provided a \$20,000 donation in 2022; and

WHEREAS, the estimated yearly economic value of library services to the community is in excess of three million dollars which means for every \$1 invested, \$3.68 of value is returned to the Borough while the cost to the local taxpayer is 16 cents a day; and

WHEREAS, the goal of the Metuchen Public Library, the Board of Trustees, and the Friends of the Library is to connect through innovative and inclusive programs and services focusing on equity, diversity, inclusion, and intellectual freedom, which are vital values to Metuchen families.

BUSCH, Mayor of Borough of Metuchen, do hereby encourage all residents of Metuchen to celebrate the valuable role our librarians, library staff, and volunteers play in transforming lives, supporting families, educating our children, and strengthening our community. ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 110-51 (APPLICABILITY) IN CHAPTER 110 (LAND DEVELOPMENT) CONCERNING THE APPLICABILITY OF MAJOR SITE PLAN APPLICATIONS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Metuchen as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 110-51 (Applicability) in Article 13 (Major Site Plan Applications) in Part II (Applications for Development) in Chapter 110 (Land Development) of the Code of the Borough of Metuchen is hereby amended to read as follows:

§110-51 Applicability.

- A. The construction of a new principal structure.
- B. An addition to an existing principal structure, except an addition which meets the requirements of Article 12 of this chapter.
- C. The construction of an accessory structure, exclusive of A/C condenser units, generators and tanks, except an accessory structure which meets the requirements of Articles 2 and 12 of this chapter.
- D. The use of land for a driveway or parking lot, involving the creation of five or more parking spaces or 1,000 or more square feet in area.
- E. Any application for a conditional use approval pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:55D-67.
- F. Any application requiring a variance pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:55D-70(d).

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. If any portion of this ordinance shall be determined to be invalid, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of said ordinance.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with law and upon filing with the Middlesex County Planning Board.

ORDINANCE 2023-08

Borough of Metuchen County of Middlesex State of New Jersey

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10, ENTITLED "COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES" RESTRUCTURING THE "MUNICIPAL ALLIANCE BOARD – YOUTH SERVICE BOARD" TO BECOME THE COMMUNITY ACTION FOR RECOVERY, EDUCATION, AND SUPPORT ("CARES') COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, Article 10, of Chapter 10 of the Code of the Borough of Metuchen established a Municipal Alliance – Youth Service Board and provided for the appointments of its members and the powers and duties of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Metuchen have determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to prevent and reduce substance abuse and behavioral addictions and to promote mental wellness in the Borough by raising awareness and providing education focused on prevention and recovery; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Metuchen have determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to restructure the Municipal Alliance Board – Youth Service Board and to create the Community Action Recovery, Education and Support Committee to operate in its stead.

NOW THEREFOR BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Metuchen that it hereby amends Chapter 10, Article 10 of the Code of the Borough of Metuchen to state as follows:

Article 10. Community Action for Recovery, Education and Support ("CARES") Committee

§ 10-35. Establishment; Composition; Purpose.

There is hereby established a Community Action for Recovery, Education and Support ("CARES") Committee which shall be composed of no more than 15 members, not including the Mayor who may serve as an ex-officio nonvoting member of the Committee. To the extent possible, members of the Board shall be representative of the community.

The purpose of the CARES Committee is to prevent and reduce substance use and behavioral additions and to promote mental wellness in the Borough of Metuchen by raising awareness and providing education through programs focused on prevention and recovery.

The Mayor and Council in its discretion may provide the Committee an annual budget to the CARES Committee for funding and sponsoring programs and promoting mental wellness consistent with the purpose set forth herein.

§ 10-36. Appointment; Selection of Chairperson; vacancies.

- A. All 15 members of the CARES Committee are to be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council. Membership shall include the following:
 - (1) One member of the Borough Council, who shall serve as a voting member.
 - (2) A representative from the Police Department, the Chief or his designee, who shall serve as a voting member.
 - (3) The Board shall include a volunteer psychological counselor, who shall serve as a voting member.

- (4) A representative of the Board of Education, who shall serve as a voting member.
- (5) Eleven residents of Metuchen, at least one of whom shall be under the age of 18, all of which shall be voting members, except for the elected Chairperson, who shall only be eligible to vote in the event of a tie.
- B. To the extent possible, of the eleven (11) members set forth in Section 6 above, the Mayor and Council shall consider the following for appointment to the Committee: a Student Assistance Coordinator or another student support services staff member; a representative of Parent-Teacher Organizations or Home School Association; Parents and/or Guardians of Borough students; a representatives of local faith-based organizations; Individuals who have been affected by substance use disorders and/or behavioral addictions, including those affected by their own or a family member's addiction; private citizens with interest in issues concerning substance use, addiction, and juvenile delinquency; representatives of local civic or volunteer groups; representatives from Youth Services Organizations; representatives of local businesses; a Senior Citizen representative; health and human services agencies/professionals; including healthcare professionals including pharmacists, physicians, or therapists; representatives of public and private organizations involved in the prevention and treatment of substance use disorders and behavioral addictions; and/or representatives of the local communications media or public relations to serve on the CARES Committee.
- C. The terms of the members appointed under Subsection A(1) and A(4) shall be coextensive with their terms of office. The remaining members shall be appointed for terms of three years. However, at the time of the passage of this amendment to this Article, all present members of the Municipal Alliance — Youth Service Board shall continue to serve in that capacity as members on the CARES Committee until the expiration of their current terms. Any vacancies on the current Municipal Alliance — Youth Service Board, to the extent possible, shall be filled for terms to be determined by the Mayor with the consent of the Borough Council. Thereafter, each appointment to the CARES Committee shall be for three years. Members shall serve after the expiration of their terms until their respective successors shall have been appointed and have qualified. Vacancies occurring other than by the expiration of the term shall be filled in like manner, but for the balance of the unexpired term only. The Board shall advise the Mayor and Council of any vacancies among its membership. The determination of a vacancy on the Board shall be determined by the Council of the Borough based upon the criteria set forth in the Municipal Vacancy Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:16-1 et seq. The Board shall designate one of its members as Chairperson, and they shall serve as such until the first day of January next following the appointment and until their successor shall be appointed and qualify. The Chairperson shall only be eligible to vote on Committee matters in the case of a tie vote. All members shall serve without compensation.

§ 10-37. Powers and duties.

The CARES Committee shall have the following powers and duties:

- A. Determine through an annual assessment of community-based needs, the scope and depth of substance use and behavioral addictions in the Borough of Metuchen and to provide comprehensive community-based prevention programs and outreach.
- B. Organize and coordinate efforts with the Borough of Metuchen schools, faith-based groups, youth members of the community, law enforcement, business groups and other community organizations for the purpose of reducing substance use disorders and behavioral addictions, as well as promoting mental wellness.
- C. Provide comprehensive substance use and behavioral addiction education, support and outreach efforts for parents and other adults in the community.
- D. Establish, amend and supplement its own bylaws, select other officers, and create any such sub-committees, to govern its structure, operations and activities to the extent not inconsistent with this Article or any other local, state or federal regulation or law.
- E. Make recommendations to the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Metuchen and other Borough agencies with respect to any matters relating to the existence of any grants or funding available to the Borough to further the purpose and intent of the Committee.
- F. Create and foster a network of community leaders, private citizens, and representatives from public and private human service agencies who are dedicated to supporting and developing ed educational programs which prevent and/or reduce substance use disorders and behavioral addictions.
- G. Conduct an assessment of the community-wide needs pertaining to mental wellness and addiction.
- H. Identify existing efforts and services that are acting to prevent and reduce substance use disorders and behavioral addictions and to coordinate projects within the Borough to avoid fragmentation and duplication.
- I. Develop programs and/or projects to be implemented at the Borough level or participate in regionally developed programs that accomplish the purpose of the Committee.
- J. Report to the Mayor and Council on at the very least a quarterly annual basis or as requested by the Mayor and/or Council.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council that all prior ordinances, or sections of ordinances, inconsistent with the within ordinance are hereby repealed.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council that all remaining sections of Chapter 10 not amended herein shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council that if any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall continue in full force and effect, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council that this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF METUCHEN AND THE COMPOSITION OF THE PARADE COMMISSION INCREASING ITS MEMBERSHIP FROM FIVE (5) MEMBERS TO SEVEN (7) MEMBERS

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Metuchen have determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to amend the composition of the Parade Commission of the Borough of Metuchen to increase its membership from five (5) members to seven (7) members.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Metuchen that it hereby amends Chapter 10, Article 13 of the Code of the Borough of Metuchen, specifically § 10-44, entitled "Establishment; composition" to state as follows:

Article 13. Metuchen Parade Commission

§ 10-44. Establishment; composition.

There is hereby established a Metuchen Parade Commission to organize, oversee and conduct the two parades annually in the Borough: 1) the Memorial Day Parade; and 2) the Winter Festival Parade for the Borough of Metuchen. The Parade Commission shall be made up of seven members. The membership of the Commission shall be composed of residents of, or owners or operators of businesses in the Borough of Metuchen. At least one member of the Commission shall have served, or is currently a member of one of the branches of the United States Armed Forces. Each member's term of office shall be for a period of three years on a staggering basis. The initial appointment of its initial five members shall be as follows: two members for a term of three years; two members for a term of two years and one member for a term of one year. The initial appointment of the two (2) additional members shall be as follows: one member for a term of a term of three years; and one members for a term of two years. Thereafter, the term of all of its members shall be for a period of three years.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council that all prior ordinances, or sections of ordinances, inconsistent with the within ordinance are hereby repealed.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council that all remaining sections of Chapter 10, Sections 45 through 46 not amended herein shall not be affected hereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council that if any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall continue in full force and effect, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.
