## **<u>Reports Of Council Members</u>**

Council President Delia reported on recent and upcoming MDA events including their Valentine's Day celebration and promotions, and a Lunar New Year celebration. He also reported that the February Traffic and Transportation Committee meeting had been canceled.

Councilmember Jethwani reported on upcoming Library events including the annual Local History Day and a collage workshop. She also reminded residents of the availability of the Seed Library and mentioned that the Library was seeking a part-time bookkeeper.

Councilmember Hyman reported that the Board of Health would be hosting a screening of a Bike Safety film, and that the Parade Commission was seeking participants for the Memorial Day Parade. She also mentioned that the CARES Committee was working to plan a community leaders' breakfast to discuss how different groups can work together with CARES.

Councilmember Giamboi reported that the Shade Tress Commission met last week and reminded homeowners that this year's tree plantings will take place in the fall. She also highlighted the many benefits of joining the Senior Center and encouraged local seniors to join. Regarding the anticipated upcoming snow, Councilmember Giamboi reminded residents to use pet-friendly salt.

## **Report of the Borough Administrator**

Melissa Perilstein reminded residents that on February 22 at 1:00 p.m. in Council Chambers there will be a meeting regarding the 2024 Housing and Community Development Grant. Residents are invited to come and give suggestions for the use of these funds.

# **Report of the Mayor**

Mayor Busch noted that we're expecting snow and that he's been in touch with Police, Public Works, and the Superintendent of Schools to assure we'll be ready. He reminded residents that they must clear their sidewalks and asked that they help their elderly and less-able neighbors when

possible. Mayor Busch also stressed the importance of removing cars from the road when there's an impending storm so Public Works can plow the more efficiently.

**WHEREAS**, on or October 24, 2022, the Borough of Metuchen adopted Ordinance 2022-19, which allowed for, *inter alia*, three (3) Class 5 Cannabis Retail License to operate within certain locations within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2022-19 also provided that in order to operate a Class 5 Retail Cannabis establishment, a license must be issued by the Borough Council, as well as the State of New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission; and

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance 2022-19 also set forth the local process to obtain a conditional license to be issued by the Borough Council, Ordinance 2022-19 (Section § 72-7(A)), provided for the issuance of a Request for Proposals and for the public advertisement for applicants seeking a license to submit an application for review and consideration; Section § 72-7(D)

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authorized the creation of a Cannabis Subcommittee which is to review submissions and/or proposals for any cannabis license and issue a Letter of Endorsement to the successful candidate/s who are required to meet a minimum score; Thereafter, the candidate/s who are issued a Letter of Endorsement are entitled to proceed with an application to the appropriate Land Use Board for their review and consideration; and upon receiving the appropriate land use approval, the applicants are forwarded to the Borough Council for the review and approval of a conditional municipal license; and

**WHEREAS**, at the February 13, 2023 Mayor and Council meeting, the members of the Cannabis Subcommittee, not specifically designated in Ordinance 2022-19, were appointed; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 2, 2023, the Borough of Metuchen issued and advertised a Request for Class 5 Cannabis Retail Business Applications ("RFA") which provided for responses to be provided by April 6, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough received seven (7) responses from interested entities, including a response from Dasco Solutions, LLC; and

**WHEREAS**, the Cannabis Subcommittee reviewed and evaluated the responses pursuant to the criteria established in the RFA and reported its findings to the Mayor and Council on May 22, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, by letter dated May 18, 2023, the Cannabis Subcommittee issued its Letter of Endorsement to Dasco Solutions in order for Dasco Solutions to proceed to file an application with the Planning Board for review and consideration; and

**WHEREAS**, Dasco Solutions filed an application with the Planning Board for review and consideration for Preliminary and Final Major Site Plan Approval, conditional use approval and waiver of submission requirements; and

**WHEREAS**, by way of Resolution dated January 5, 2024, the Planning Board of the Borough of Metuchen granted Dasco Solutions Preliminary and Final Site Plan Approval, conditional use approval and waiver of submission requirements subject to various terms and conditions; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No 2022-19, Dasco Solutions has requested the Borough of Metuchen and its Council provide Dasco a Resolution of Support endorsing Dasco Solutions' application for a Class 5 Cannabis Retail License to the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission along with the required zoning certification letter; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Metuchen have determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to adopt a Resolution of Support endorsing Dasco Solutions' application for a Class 5 Cannabis Retail License to the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission and the issuance of a conditional municipal license subject to its compliance with all of the terms, conditions and requirements of the Planning Board Resolution, Redevelopment Plan, and Redevelopment Agreement, all local ordinances and receipt of all necessary approvals to conduct operations therefore; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Metuchen has imposed a limit on the number of licensed Class 5 Cannabis Retail Licenses that can operate in the Borough, and the issuance of a license to Dasco by the State of New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission ("CRC") would not exceed that limit.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the Borough of Metuchen that the Borough hereby approves a conditional municipal license for a Class 5 Cannabis Retail Establishment to Dasco Solutions subject to its compliance with all of the terms, conditions and requirements of the Planning Board Resolution, Redevelopment Plan, and Redevelopment Agreement, all local ordinances and receipt of all necessary approvals to conduct operations therefore; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Council of the Borough of Metuchen that the Borough supports the Dasco Solutions Class 5 Cannabis Retail License application to the Cannabis Regulatory Commission, subject to its compliance with all of the terms, conditions and
