

The bill, which is expected to be signed by the President early next week, includes a line-item for \$800,000 for the redesign, improvement and paving of our Edgar Middle School parking lot that is also shared by the Metuchen Municipal Pool.

Metuchenites are all too familiar with the terrible condition of the Edgar lot and I just got off the phone with our Congressman Frank Pallone Jr. to thank him for his work on behalf of the Borough.
